
Y6 Parent Meeting

World Book Day

In celebration of World Book Day, which takes place on Thursday 6th March, we are sharing with you in advance of how we would like pupils to celebrate this event. We are looking at the theme of 'hair' as part of our unique identity, and as such inviting pupils and staff to celebrate this. This is linked to a whole school focus upon 'seeing ourselves' in society and particularly seeing how we are represented in books. We believe this provides pupils with an inclusive option of celebrating their uniqueness and individuality.
