The Golden Rule

Luke 6:27-38

On Sunday, we listened to Luke's Gospel setting out Jesus' vision for how His disciples were to live their lives and in turn how we are asked to live our lives as followers of Him. We recognise that to live according to the Golden Rule and Jesus' vision is an extremely difficult one and is very much at odds with the world that we live in. The problem that Jesus' first followers found with this teaching is one that we too still struggle with today, regardless of the many advancements that have taken place in other aspects of our modern lives. We do and can take inspiration from Dr Martin Luther King, who managed to live and follow the Golden Rule, in the face of extreme hatred and adversity.

To truly live out Jesus' vision is to change how we behave and view one another. We are asked to show compassion and understanding to all. It is to treat everyone, as we would like to be treated and to do so with compassion. We look to Jesus' example of love and forgiveness to all, through His death on the cross and His resurrection. As always, we ask for God's help and strength in following the Golden Rule.

Emmaus Trust Update


