To how we can treat one another with compassion, with love and with forgiveness rather than judgement and criticism.

As we begin our Lenten journey we are asked to show love, compassion and forgiveness to those who we meet. When Jesus addresses His followers in Luke’s Gospel, He speaks of the power of the human heart and the ability that we all have to transform the world around us in showing God’s love. May we be witnesses to this, during this season of Lent.

Year 3/4 have been developing their throwing and catching skills





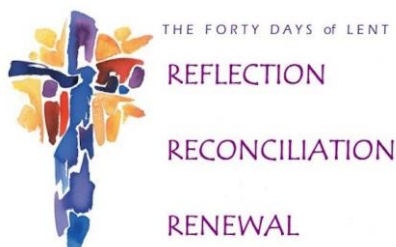
