The Transfiguration of our Lord

This Sunday's Gospel Reading from Luke is one that is celebrated on the second Sunday of Lent. This special event has been the focus of our Good News assemblies this week.

We have reflected on the image of Jesus that we have in this Gospel reading. The contrast between divinity and humanity is a strong one. Jesus is transfigured in glory and majesty on the mountain as the Chosen One, the One who comes from the Father, the One who stands above all others. He is revealed to those present and to us through the Gospel.

We contrast this with the familiar image that we have of Jesus as the inspiring teacher, the compassionate preacher, the friend of the poor, a humble carpenter, a son and a friend.

Just as Peter, John and James were energised by what they saw on top of the mountain, we too can feel this transformation in our lives. Through our relationship with God, we too can see in a different way. We can come to see the beauty and love in the faces of our family, our friends, our colleagues and all who we meet. During our Lenten journey, we remember that God loves us and that God's love changes everything.
